


- Transgender, bisexual, lesbian, gay

- Have ADHD






California Community Colleges Online Success Rates

Online Courses Are Harming the Students Who Need the Most Help

"... less proficient students tend to run into trouble. After all, taking a class without a teacher requires high levels of self-motivation, self-regulation and organization."

Weakest students more likely to take online college classes but do worse in them

"The interaction between a student and an instructor is an intrinsic part of the educational process and we need to be very, very cautious before watering down this requirement."










EQUITY: provide students what they need to succeed
